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Operational readiness for e-commerce (ORE) workshops for Africa Designated Operators

Since the inception of the ORE Project, the UPU conducted 11 successful workshops held in Kenya, Tanzania, Cameroon, Egypt, Senegal, and Togo.

Based on the pandemic situation, 4 of the 11 workshops were held remotely using the Microsoft teams platform as follows:

14 and 16 July 2020 for French speaking countries (40 participants);

27 and 29 July 2020 for English speaking countries (72 participants).

112 participants included the National Country Project Managers, the Postmasters General, the Restricted Unions (PAPU, CRASA, SAPOA and EACO), African Union, UPU Facilitators and the UPU Staff-Members of the Development Cooperation and Operations Directorates.

These important workshops assessed the achievements of Countries Roadmaps and National Action Plans, the improvement of quality of service performance, and shared the actions taken for the implementation of unrealized activities.

Although a good amount of progress has been made on the 5 pillars (minimum operational requirements; visibility; data quality; supply chain integration;

reliability) since the kick off project in 2016, the Africa Program continues to monitor the progress.

The countries of the Africa Region were also requested to make efforts in meeting the requirements of Electronic Advance Data (EAD), therefore expedite the implementation of the Customs Declaration System (CDS) through the UPU EAD Global Project, with a view to ensure that all Designated Operators will have capability to send and receive ITMATT by January 2021.

Other fields such as IPS, Certification under S42 UPU Addressing had been addressed as well.

Electronic advanced data (EAD) captures, transmission and compliance project

The aim of the EAD project is to enable the designated operators (DOs) of countries in the Africa region to capture and transmit EAD in compliance with UPU EAD requirements, ahead of the upcoming regulatory deadline in January 2021.

In order to report on the progress of the project, remote workshops were held for Africa region covering the following topics:

Project gouvernance;

EAD project in a nutshell: goals, work packages, schedule;

EAD roadmap and upcoming requirements with regard to customs, transport, security, compliance and reporting;

Action plan for phase 1 of the project, follow-up on Customs Declaration System (CDS) training sessions and ITMATT implementation plans.

Integrated quality reporting system (IQRS) and GMS star

Within the framework of the key strategic project on Operational Readiness for E-commerce (ORE) and as part of the capacity building program, online trainings are being held on IQRS and GMS STAR. The objective of these on-line trainings, is to enhance the skills of operational staff of designated operators in the region.

The trainings are conducted under two separate sessions within the English and French speaking countries and divided into 5 topics for each group as follows:

Topics 1

IQRS - Dashboard and reporting

UPU COVID-19 protective equipment

Shipments of protective masks have been sent through a joint project organized by the Universal Postal Union (UPU), and the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS).

The UPU organized the project through its development cooperation budget, as well as donations from China (People's Rep.), France, Japan and Switzerland.

Comoros, Ethiopia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mozambique, Senegal and Zambia have since received their shipment. As for Angola, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Central Africa, Lesotho, Niger, Rwanda, Tanzania (United Rep.) and Togo, they are in the process of receiving theirs.

Disaster Risk Management

A remote workshop on disaster risk management (DRM) for supervisory ministries, regulatory authorities and designated operators in the Africa region will be held before the end of the year. This workshop will enable the participants to acquire a basic understanding of DRM, as well as practical knowledge on DRM planning and DRM training. Moreover, the participants will be expected to promote DRM activities to develop disasterresilient and secure postal services in their countries.

In the line of the Disaster Risk management activities, Benin, Malawi and Rwanda will benefit from the UPU technical assistance project on disaster risk management within the framework of the Disaster Risk Fund aiming to facilitate their readiness for natural disasters.
