160th anniversary joint stamp issue

Dear Sir/Madam.

The **INTERNATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATION UNION (ITU)**, the UN specialized agency for information and communication technologies, asks us to convey the following message to the designated operators of UPU member countries:

"We are pleased to share the logo for the commemoration of ITU's 160th anniversary from 1 January to 31 December 2025 (see Annex 1). On this special occasion, you may wish to consider issuing a stamp commemorating communication milestones in your country. We invite you to integrate the ITU160 logo "as is", without altering its colours and proportions.

"The Union's journey began on 17 May 1865, following the International Telegraph Conference in Paris, which led to the creation of the International Telegraph Union – the forerunner of today's ITU. This was a significant milestone in international cooperation, marking the beginning of modern efforts to coordinate telecommunications on a global scale.

"Over 160 years, the Union has been at the forefront of emerging technologies – from telegraphy to fixed telephony, radio, television, satellites, mobile telephony, Internet, broadband, cloud computing, cybersecurity, artificial intelligence and virtual worlds. ITU has won six Emmy Awards!
