



The Universal Postal Union (UPU) was founded in 1874 in Bern, Switzerland, and is one of the oldest international organizations in the world. In 1948, it became a specialized agency of the United Nations in the field of communications and transport, dedicated to providing technical support and establishing a platform for cooperation among postal organizations around the world.

Over the years, the UPU has expanded from 22 member countries to 192 member countries, making it the largest postal network in the world. The UPU has always adhered to its objectives: (1) to organize and improve international postal services, and to promote international cooperation and development in this field; (2) to link the world through postal services so as to promote international cooperation in the cultural, social and economic fields.

On 16 November 1972, the Convention concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage was adopted by the 17th General Conference of UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) held in Paris. The Convention has defined Cultural and Natural

Heritage, and also standardized the protection measures at both national and international levels. Later, a World Heritage Committee was established in accordance with the Convention to regularly select cultural and natural heritage sites from countries and regions around the world as the "World Heritage Sites"

that need to be protected, and inscribe them on the "World Heritage List". As of the end of 2021, 1154 sites have been inscribed on the "World Heritage List" globally, including 56 sites in China.

Collections of the Palace Museum





As the largest museum in China that houses collections of treasures in the possession of the imperial families through the dynasties, the Palace Museum has well preserved more than 1,000 pieces of clocks from Britain, France, Switzerland and some other countries, as well as those manufactured by the imperial workshop of the Qing dynasty, dating from the 18th century to the early 20th century. The meticulous mechanical work and the extravagant decorative workmanship of these pieces represent the highest level of clock-making technology at that time and have made the Palace Museum one of the best museums of its kind in the world.

The Eighteen Arhats

The Arhat, "Luohan" or "Aluohan" in Chinese, is a transliteration from Sanskrit. The word has three denotations: the first is to eliminate all the disturbances; the second is to gain the veneration of other living things; and the third is to achieve Nirvana and not to be subject to the cycle of reincarnations.

This issue includes a set of eighteen stamps from the oil painting "Eighteen Arhats", which is skillfully painted by the famous Macao painter Sou Farong on rice paper. The Arhats are delineated as traditional Buddhist monks, each in a different "realistic" posture, some posing relaxingly, and others sitting rigidly and solemnly.






Chinese Classical Poetry - Poems of Song Dynasty

The poems of the Tang Dynasty and Ci of the Song Dynasty are both important legacies of China's cultural heritage. Poems are recited while Ci is for singing. Some Ci, such as "Like a Dream", "Nanxiangzi" and "Nian Nu Jiao", have their own melodies, and are also known as "tune patterns". First, the lyricist selects the tune pattern. Then he follows its specific rules concerning word count, tones and rhymes in order to choose the words and rhymes of the Ci. Besides, he must also pay attention to the meaning of the lyrics. The difficulty level of all this is quite high. This is why Song Ci is considered the greatest achievement of Song Dynasty literature. Song Ci has both long and short verses, making it suitable for singing, and those verses are

the lyrics of the song, which are also known as "song lyrics", "houses of music", "movements", "long and short sentences", among others.

These intangible cultural heritage items have been passed down through generations in Macao and are closely related to daily life,

including folk customs, traditional skills, performing arts, etc. Among them, the intangible cultural heritage in the category of performing arts is diversified in form and variety, with items that embody the inheritance of Chinese traditional culture in Macao and those deeply influenced by Portuguese culture, such as Taoist Ritual Music, Patuá Theatre, Portuguese Folk Dance, Baatyam Percussion and Cantonese Opera.



Macao Bridge




The Macao Bridge is located on the east side of the Friendship Bridge, spans over the Outer Harbour Channel and the Macao Channel. It connects Macao's three important ports of sea, land and air, and is a key node in the construction of Macao's urban transportation system. The bridge not only serves as an important connecting passage between the Artificial Island of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge

Port, the reclaimed New Urban Zone Area A and Taipa, but also a main traffic artery for residents of New Urban Zone Area A. After the bridge is opened to traffic, it will provide more transportation options for residents and effectively alleviate the traffic pressure on the existing sea-crossing bridges, contributing to the overall sustainable development of the city.

The Chapel of Our Lady of Penha is located on the top of the Penha Hill. It was originally constructed by the Augustinians in 1622, reconstructed in 1837 and 1935 respectively, and was fully renovated in 1999. With its unique architectural style and spire-style clock tower, the Chapel is not only one of the landmarks in the western end of Macao peninsula, but

also a part of the territory's precious cultural heritage. It is listed in the category of "Buildings of architectural interest" under the Classified Immovable Properties according to the Macao Special Administrative Region Government.

and Formula 3 at the same time. Together with its fast straights and twisting sharp bends, the Guia Circuit is recognized as one of the most challenging street circuits in the world.

75 Years of the Publication of O Clarim

The birth of O Clarim originated from an initiative of seven Catholic youth who wanted to start a newspaper in 1948, in order to respond to the needs of the society. In supporting the Catholics as usual, the Macau Catholic Diocese supported them in the publication of the Catholic newspaper in Macao. According to the Holy Bible, the word "Clarim",

which means "horn" or "trumpet", carries different meanings and conveys different messages depending on the number of trumpets, length of blowing, etc. With reference to the meaning of "Clarim" in the Bible, it is believed that the newspaper "O Clarim" carries the mission of transmitting messages, and most importantly, Truth.
