

LEVERAGING THE SINGLE POSTAL TERRITORY: ENHANCING GLOBAL CONNECTIVITY AND COOPERATION

This panel will delve into goal 1 of the UPU's proposed strategic framework for 2026–2029, which focuses on leveraging the single postal territory through an effective rule-based system. Discussions will centre around the normative role of the UPU in creating and fostering the global rule-based system and underlying standards that lead to an interconnected global postal network.

Panellists will explore how the UPU's initiatives safeguard the single postal territory and ensure equitable access for citizens, customers and businesses worldwide.

Key questions and areas of discussion include:

What key policy and regulatory challenges will member countries have to address in the Dubai cycle and beyond?

How can improved multilateral rule-based systems enhance accessibility and efficiency in the global postal market?

How can standards and frameworks be further strengthened to result in better optimized cross-border postal supply chains?

How can enhanced platforms for dialogue and knowledge sharing foster collaboration and innovation within the postal community?

What strategies are effective in diversifying postal services to meet evolving market demands and emerging opportunities?


